### **PTA Funding**


The PTA are currently purchasing

### **Education Strategy**

The Education Strategy established by the Committee for Education, Sport and Culture serves as a compass for what our Education system needs to deliver. The strategy acts as the glue that holds together our overarching priorities. It is split into 4 priorities as shown in the graphic below and describes how these commitments will ensure the best outcomes for our children.



#### How this looks in our school

- Mrs Ballentine is the child protection officer. Mrs Fyfe and Mrs Coughlin also trained to the same level
- Mrs Coughlin maintains an overview of all safeguarding in school.
- All school staff have received regular safeguarding training.
- All PTA committee members have DBS checks and undertaken Level 1 safeguarding training.
- Robust system in school for reporting concerns about children.
- Children's attendance at school regularly monitored.
- Regular parent helpers hold DBS checks.
- Regular site checks around site safety such as all gates being locked in school time.
- Regular staff training i.e. LSA's undertaking training on domestic abuse, understanding the needs of families where a parent may be in prison.
- Children taught about keeping safe both physically and about online safety.
- Opportunities to talk—worry box, positive relationships in school enable children to talk to an adult when they are worried. Children report that they feel listened to.
- Staff wearing high viz jackets so the children can spot them easier when being supervised outside.
