This was originally planned for the 8th of May.



# **Education Strategy**

The Education Strategy established by the Committee for Education, Sport and Culture serves as a compass for what our Education system needs to deliver. The strategy acts as the glue that holds together our overarching priorities. It is split into 4 priorities as shown in the graphic below and describes how these commitments will ensure the best outcomes for our children.



### How this looks in our school

- The "curriculum" refers to the subject matter that we teach the children. This is centred around the Bailiwick Curriculum.
- Long term map of learning for the whole school ie Romans in Year 3, Great Fire of London in Year 2 etc.
- Continual focus and staff training days spent on ensuring that the learning is focused into key knowledge that the children can recall and build on each year. Curriculum in Reception adapted each year to meet the needs and interests of the children.
- Ensuring that our children are able to recall their learning but going back to previous learning over the year by building in opportunities to recall key facts.
- Targets shared with children in literacy to help them make progress and be part of knowing how to succeed in writing.
- Large emphasis in the Infants on teaching phonics and learning to read as this is key to enable the children to access the curriculum and affects all areas of their learning.
- Ensuring that the children have access to a range of partners to assist a broad experience of the curriculum such as theatre visits, St Johns ambulance, Fire Brigade, SHARE nurses.
- Ensuring that the curriculum enables children to learn about different cultures, beliefs and customs
- Headteacher and Deputy head teacher meet all staff each term to discuss every child's progress in school to ensure children are making progress.
- SENCO meets regularly to discuss with all staff any children who may be struggling to make the same progress.
- Staff provide additional groups and focused teaching for children where needed.
- We adapt the curriculum where needed to ensure that all children who have different needs or different beliefs can access and participate in the learning .
- We ensure that there is a balance between the subjects in school such as the same amount of art as design technology.
- All subjects have a lead teacher who oversees the planning and ensures the subject is taught according to the planning.
